

EEASA MEMBERS OPINION SURVEY

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The following are the results of an anonymous opinion survey included in the Southern African Journal of Environmental Education No.7.

Of 297 questionnaires posted out, 44 (14,8%) were returned. In comparison with similar surveys in Southern Africa this constitutes a reasonably good sample although one would have hoped that in the case of a semi professional association such as EEASA the response would have been greater. The results obtained may however be interpreted as a reasonably valid reflection of members' views.

There were 28 responses to this question. 16 either gave no answer or general responses such as 'all articles' or 'most'. Of 60 major articles published up to the time of the survey 35 were mentioned. The contributor most frequently mentioned was R. O'Donoghue (14 times). Environmental Education Centres were mentioned 7 times and resource reviews 6 times.




FIGURE 1 Responses to the question: 'What is your occupation?'

- Die 3 'nee' antwoorde is soos volg:

Journal too large. Cover marks easily.

Should be A5 size (1/2 A4). Print too small.
Text valuable but needs more pictures, drawings and diagrams.
Typewritten format looks skimpy.

Of the 5 'no' responses 4 did not give a reason. 1 stated 'te gesofistikeerd'. Of the 8 'not sure' response 6 gave no further reason. 1 respondent stated that 'as the Journal is non-refereed it does not (unfortunately) attract university recognition' while the other respondent stated that he/she was 'unsure of what environmental education is about and the relevance of it'.

* For the information of readers a 'refereed' journal/publication is one in which articles are carefully scrutinized and commented upon (in terms of standard) by a panel of 'experts', usually in the field concerned, before being published. Refereed publications attract substantial financial subsidies from the Department of National Education and benefit the institutions which employ the authors. University academics, for example, are under considerable pressure to publish in refereed journals as the resulting subsidies are part of the formula for financing universities.
