However, you also mentioned that self-use of fluoridated tooth paste at individual level, oral health education and awareness together with regular checkups can reduce the incidence of grossly carious teeth thereby avoiding the use of dental amalgam.

The Ministry of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children being the custodian of professional association relies on the Tanzanian Dental Association to play a major role in the improvement of oral health provision across the country. Your conference theme shows your commitment and I am optimistic that the gained scientific knowledge will enable you improve oral health care provision and enhance the oral health of Tanzanians at your workplaces.
